## **Retired Teacher Dies Wednesday**

**Miss Newell was  
Former Principal**

**CORUNNA** — Miss Edith M. Newell, 76, retired **Corunna** and Owosso school teacher, died at her home at 121 South Norton street early Wednesday afternoon. She had been bedridden since February. Death was due to complications.

Funeral services will be held at the Kribs Funeral Home at 2 p.m., Saturday, the Rev. James N. Cobb officiating. Burial will be in Pine Tree Cemetery. The body will rest at her residence until noon Saturday when it will be taken to the funeral home.

Miss Newell was born on February 14, 1875, the daughter of Seymour and Anna Newell. The family moved from New Haven Township to Corunna when she was five years of age. She resided at the present address ever since.

She was **graduated** from Corunna High School. She taught in the Corunna schools for a number of years before becoming principal of the Lincoln school in Owosso in September, 1918. She became principal of Central school in Owosso in September, 1933. She held that position until her retirement in June, 1946.

Miss Newell was a member of the Corunna Methodist Church and the W. S. C. S. of that church. She also was a member of the Women' Literary Society and the Priscilla Club.

Surviving is one sister, Mrs. William Duffey, of **Corunna**. A sister died in 1942.

## Corunna Pioneer Taken by Death

**Mrs. Winifred Stewart, 66, Dies Wed.**

CORUNNA, May 1. - Mrs. Winifred Stewart, 66, former teacher and widow of Jerome Stewart, of 414 South Shiawassee street, died at 5 p. m. yesterday in Memorial Hospital, victim of heart failure after several years illness with pernicious anemia and complications.

Funeral services will be held on Saturday at 3:30 p. m. at the Krebs Funeral Home, the Rev. C. E. Doty officiating. Burial will be held in Pinetree Cemetery.

Mrs. Stewart was born in Corunna August 14, 1874, the daughter of Marcus and Esther Wilcox, who had come to settle in Michigan from New York state some years before. She was graduated from Corunna High School, and as a young woman entered education, teaching in several Shiawassee County schools, including those in Owosso and Durand, as well as one in Eaton Rapids.

Later she retired to care for her elderly parents, living in the old home south of Corunna.

After their death she was married in 1900 to Mr. Stewart, Venetian township farmer. Mr. Stewart bought the old Wilcox place, and for the first 10 years of their married life the couple remained there. Then they moved to the home where Mrs. Stewart died in Corunna. Mr. Stewart died in 1920.

Surviving are four sisters, Mrs. Emma Hurlburt of Corunna, Mrs. Olive Nickels of Lansing, Mrs. Grace Hamlin of Durand, and Mrs. Nellie Hendrick of Chicago, and a large number of nieces and neph-
