#### Former Corunna Resident Dies

Dr. Erwin Eveleth Ill Two Years

CORUNNA — Dr. Erwin Eveleth. Jr., age 60, former Corunna resident, died at 2 o'clock this morning in Fraser where he had practiced medicine for the past 30 years. Death was due to complications. Dr. Eveleth had been ill for the past two years.

Funeral plans are incomplete. However, tentative plans call for a church funeral in Fraser with a graveside ceremony at Pine Tree cemetery. The Rev. W. Dean Davis, of the Episcopal Church in Owosso, will officiate at the grave.

Dr. Eveleth was born at the family homestead, 910 North Shiawassee street, on Feb. 9, 1889, the son of Erwin and Jennie Eveleth. He attended school here, graduating from Corunna High school in 1908. He later attended Detroit Medical College and began practicing medicine in Detroit. He moved to Ashley for a few years before settling in Fraser.

He was an ardent sportsman.
