CORUNNA — Homer M. Bush, retired attorney at law, died Saturday at Owosso Memorial Hospital.

Mr. Bush, 80, resided at 322 W. Mack St., Corunna.

The funeral will be held at Kribs Colonial Chapel Wednesday at 1 p.m. Burial is to be in Pine Tree Cemetery in Corunna.

The body rests at the funeral chapel, where Mr. Bush's family will receive visitors until 5 p.m. and from 7-9 p.m. today.

Mr. Bush studied law with his brother, Walter Bush, later writing and passing the state bar examination on Oct. 4, 1932.

Mr. Bush had served for six years as the Corunna city attorney; six years as a Shiawassee County Circuit Court commissioner and served as City of Corunna Justice of the Peace from 1928 to 1970, when the office was abolished and district court created.

Born in Corunna Jan. 22, 1900, he was the son of Probate Judge Matthew and Annie (Verney) Bush. He graduated from the Detroit Institute of Technology as an analytical chemist.

A lifetime Corunna area resident and graduate of Corunna High School, he and Nettie Janet Allen were married Sept. 5, 1921 in Mt. Clemens. She survives him, as do:

One sister, Mrs. Kenneth (Florence) Jacobs of Durand, two grandchildren, and a daughter-in-law of Flint.

Mr. Bush was preceded in death by his parents, three sons, one sister and six brothers.

Mr. Bush's family suggests that memorial contributions may be directed to the Shiawassee County Medical Care Facility (Pleasant View) in Corunna.
