



Teacher Retires After 43 Years

CORUNNA — After 43 years, Mrs. Evelyn Quick is retiring from teaching in the Corunna Public Schools system.

She is leaving a career which started in the Lemon School, a rural school still standing on the Garrison Road in Shiawassee Township.

She was 18 years old with only a Corunna High School diploma and six weeks of summer school at Central State Teachers College, now Central Michigan University, when she started.

She had 20 pupils in grades one through eight. She tended the furnace which she says she knew nothing about, swept and scrubbed the floors, administered first aid and supervised play time.

Later, she earned a bachelor of science degree and Permanent Elementary Certificate from Central Michigan.

Forty of her 43 years have been spent in Corunna Schools or schools now annexed to Corunna. The last 10 have been in the second grade of Nellie Reed School. She also taught for 15 years at Eveleth School which is now the Administration Building on State Road.

Mrs. Quick says that she would not trade her rich experiences in the most rewarding and exciting way of making a living. She adds that if she had it to do over again, she would choose teaching for her life career.


Miss Gladys Riley, Graduate of Corunna High School, Accident Victim

Miss Gladys Riley. 24 years old, a Detroit school teacher, who was born and reared in this county, and graduated from the Corunna high school, was including in a collision between two dars. Ervin Buck, 22, of Lansing, Miss Riley's companion, sustained injuries from which he died nine hours later.


