Age 81, passed away Tuesday, July 22, 2003, in Cassville, Missouri.


For 20 years, Mr. Middleton operated his own business, Middleton & Son Diesel Service in Corunna, and later moved to Nevada and worked for NASA.

Frederick worked in the foundry business for 25 years in Flint and 15 years in Ludington.


