

Jack Bower spent time in the Merchant Marines and was a skilled trades employee with more than 35 years at General Motors Corp.


Jo Bower worked at Consumers Power — now Consumers Energy — also at the former Old Corunna State Bank and was in real estate.

Age 76, of Owosso, passed away Thursday morning, July 22, 2004, at Memorial Healthcare Center.


Mr. Musson worked all his life in the construction industry as a carpenter, superintendent, project manager, project administrator, and consultant.

Donald and Lillian Olmsted will celebrate their 60th wedding anniversary Thursday.


The couple were married April 10, 1954, at Oak Park Methodist Church in Flint.
