two grandchildren, Morgan and Florence Cameron: sister, Benjamin; brother, Floyd (Phylis) Brands: and several nieces and nephews.







On July 3, 1947, she and Clayton Fuller Cook were married at the First Baptist Church, Owosso.



Age 80, of Owosso, passed away Thursday, June 7, 2007, at Memorial Healthcare after a long illness.




