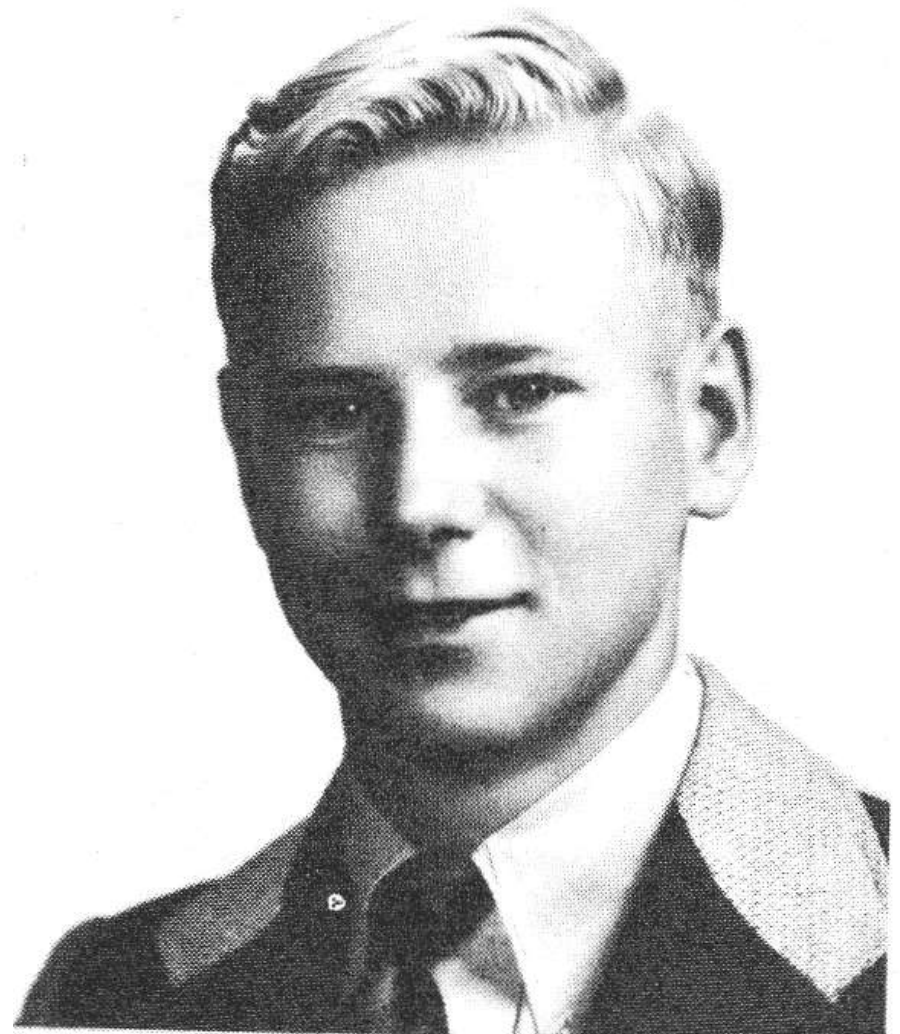

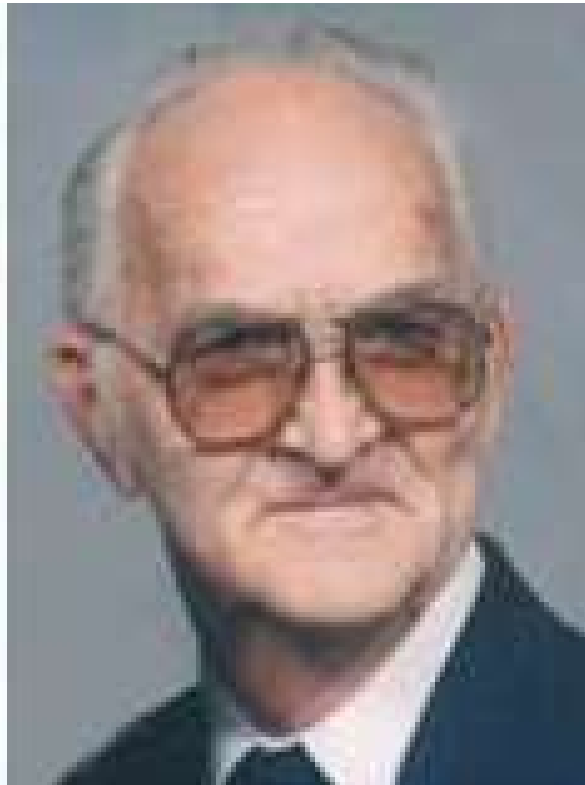

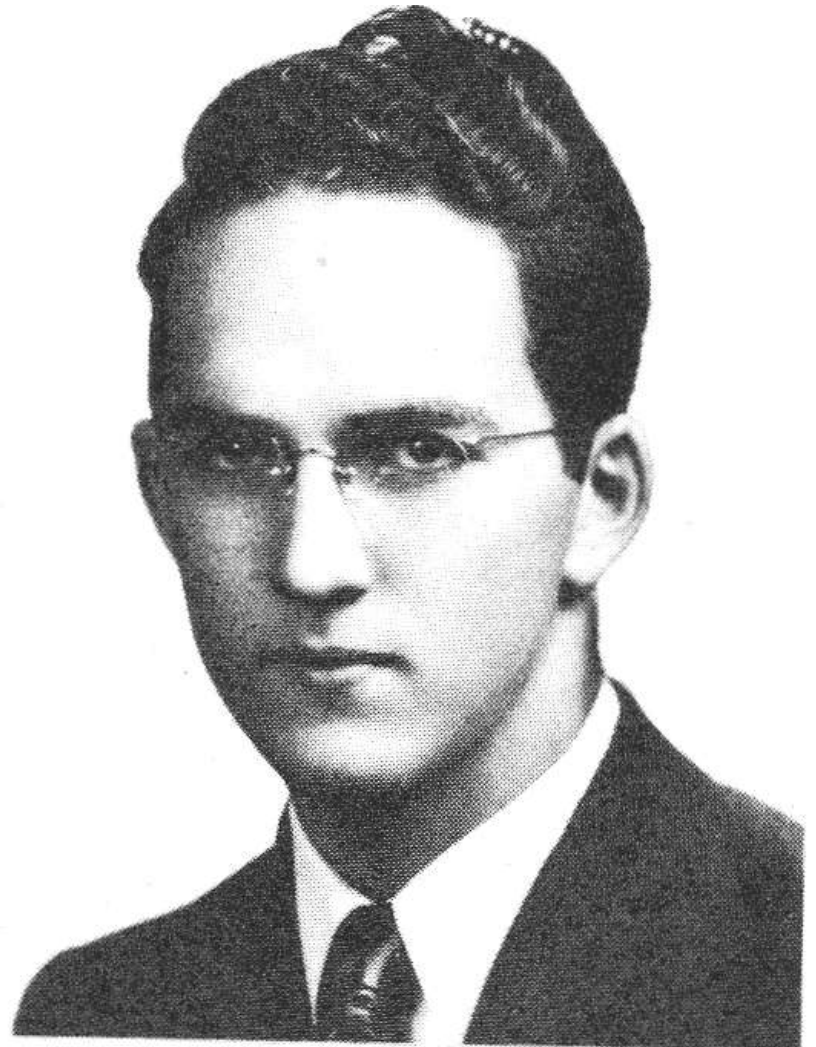

Mr. Brands had worked at Midland-Ross for 25 1/2 years and then nine years at Midwest Bus.

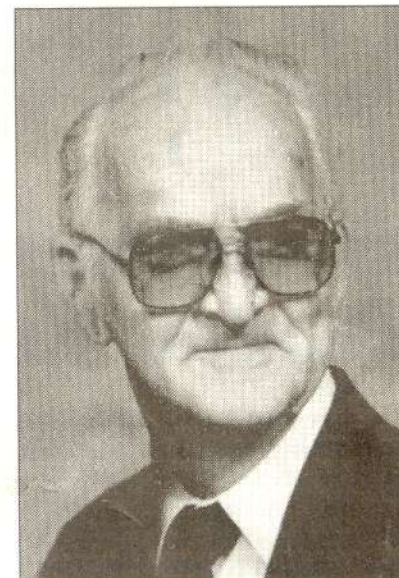

two grandchildren, Morgan and Cameron; sister, Florence Benjamin; brother, Floyd (Phyllis) Brands; and several nieces and nephews.

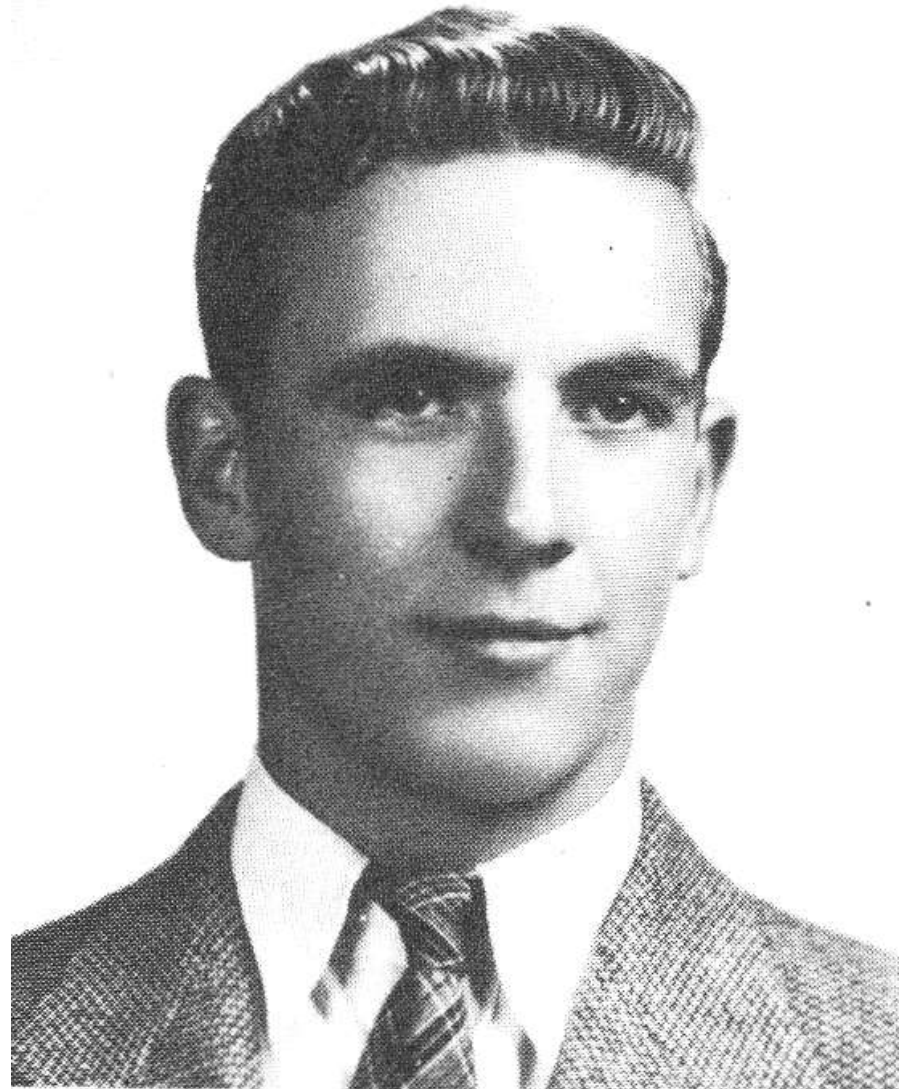

On July 3, 1947, she and Clayton Fuller Cook were married at the First Baptist Church, Owosso.

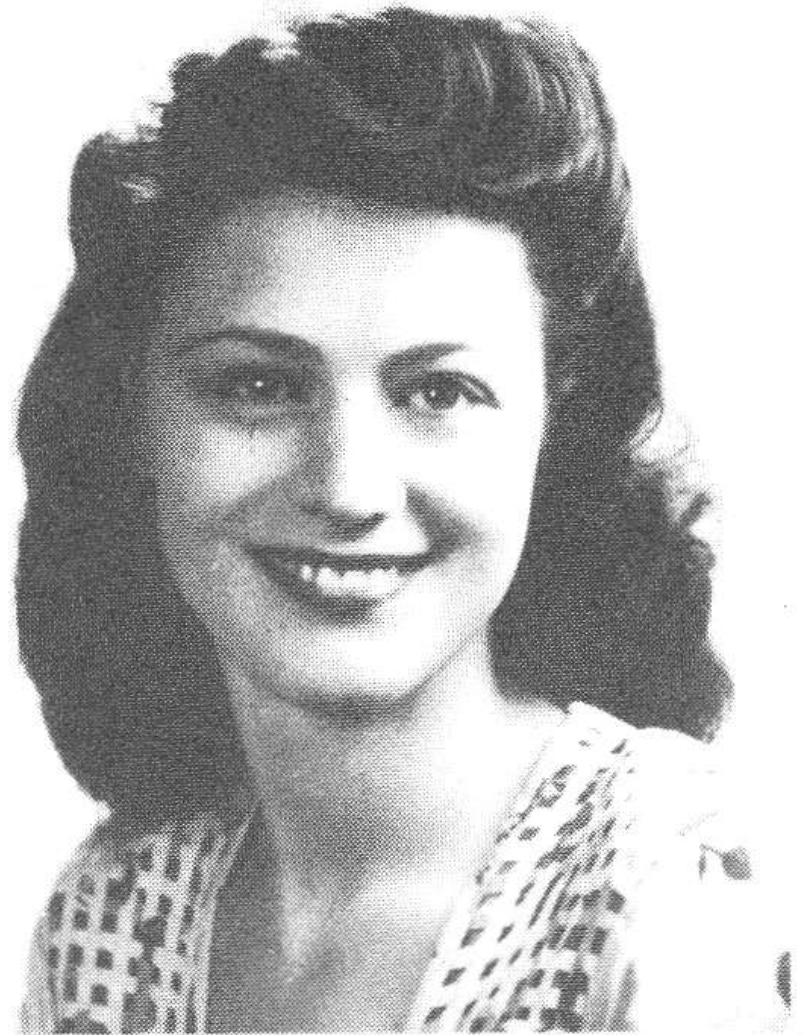

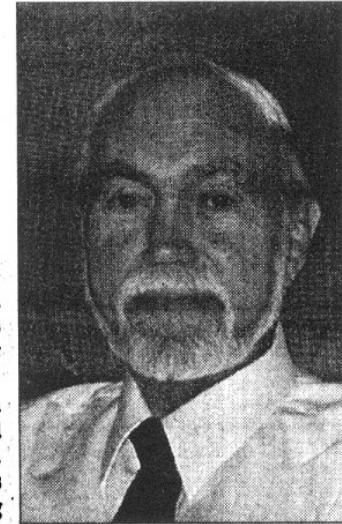
Age 80, of Owosso, passed away Thursday, June 7, 2007, at Memorial Healthcare after a long illness.

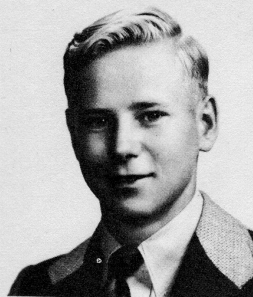
Bingo. He also loved gardening and traveling.
