
He married Barbara Stephens Wilson 10/10/2010 and they made their home at Gulf Shores and Courtland, Alabama.

We entered the Freshman Class with eager and yet somewhat frightening anticipation. Our fears were justified somewhat temporarily by the upper-classmen during initiation ceremonies. Through the careful guidance of our class advisor, Miss Carlson, we finally became adjusted sorially and mentally to the increased activities which marked our entrance into high school—the first difficult step along our path to graduation.

Mr. Lancaster proved to be of invaluable assistance as our class advisor in helping us through our trying Sophomore year. Our social activities perked up somewhat as we sponsored a very successful dance, "Swing With Spring". We began to take pride in the scholarship abilities of some of our class members as well as the pronounced ability of some of our athletes who seemed at last to be showing some degree of coordination of mind and muscle.

As Juniors, under the guidance of Mrs. Dennis, we pressed our quest for material as well as the intellectual in life. We were rapidly becoming capitalists. Among other things we had noon eandy sales, sold magazines, sponsored a Halloween Party, and put on a most successful play, "The Daffy Dills". Having thus filled our coffers with that "pretty yellow stuff" we generously spent a few dollars of it to give the Seniors a farewell "Bon Voyage Dance".

The 1949-50 school year was here at last—our goal was definitely in sight. Graduation—yes, we were much smarter now than we had ever been before or would ever be again! We decided on two class sponsors, for how could one

possibly handle a group as vigorous as we? We elected Mrs. Dennis again and Mr. Dennis, who had just joined the faculty

Our aspirations for an accumlation of wealth continued throughout this year as we were again successful in presenting "Aaron Slick from Pumkin Crick", under the direction of Mr. Brursma, another new addition to the teaching faculty. We sold papers, sponsored a Valentine Box Social and Dance, sold pop and hot dogs at home basketball games and held dances after all home games, sponsored the "Knapp Family" in two appearances at the Casino and a gala Senior Prom.

The theme which was chosen for this event was "Sidewalk Cafe" and was carried out to resemble a New York setting. Included were a park scene, a hotel and a cafe, and seated in a bus was the orchestra, Al Meerzo's, from Lansing, which played for the dancing. General Chairman was Gene Phillips, Assistant Chairman, Lester Stewart, and General Decorating Chairman, Laurae Ellis.

Our social activities prior to graduation were concluded with a trip to Niagara Falls and a full realization that our mercenary efforts were not in vain — it was a glorious three day vacation.

With graduation exercises our High School career was brought to a close. We again look eagerly and with quite some antisipation toward the future but not without a backward glance and pleasant thoughts about our experience in one of the best — Corunna High School.

Age 73, of South Branch, formerly of Owosso/Corunna, passed away Wednesday, Oct. 5, 2005, peacefully at home in South Branch after a year-long battle with lung cancer.

The funeral service will be held at 1 p.m. on Saturday, Oct. 8, at Mowen Funeral Home-William A. Scarlett Memorial Chapel, 409 W. Main St. in Owosso, with Pastor Strawser officiating. Ray Interment will follow in Pine Tree Cemetery in Corunna. Visitation at the funeral chapel will be today from 2 to 4 and 6 to 8 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. until the time of service. A Masonic memorial service will be held at 7:30 this evening, conducted by Owosso Lodge #81, F&AM.

Richard was born Nov. 1, 1931 at Owosso Memorial, Hospital, the son of Lowell H. Bouck and Leeta (Whitesell) Bouck. He was a graduate of Corunna High School, class of 1950, and apprentice-related training at General Motors Technical Institute.

He enlisted in the United States Air Force on Jan. 3, 1949 and was honorably discharged as an airman first class on Sept. 29, 1952. He was stationed in Japan during the Korean War with Norwood's Nomads, delivering ammunition, medicine and other supplies to the troops in Korea, then returning to Japan with wounded soldiers and Marines. Upon retiring in 1991, and until his death, he resided in his own home on Jose Lake in South Branch. In 1946, as a young man, he helped to build the residence as his parents' summer cottage. He was very pleased to have been able to fulfill his dream of retiring there and spending his remaining days on Jose Lake.

He liked working on his metal lathe and milling machine in his garage workshop. He created solutions to mechanical problems around his home and for his friends and neighbors. He enjoyed growing vegetables, working on projects around his yard and sit-

ting on the deck of his home watching nature's beauty out on Jose Lake.
