He married Marilyn "Kay" Lewis at St. Paul Catholic Church in Owosso on May 5, 1962.


Phillip retired from Midland Ross after 21 years of service and worked at Valley Lumber for several years.





Corunna grad will join grid Hall of Fame Michigan high school football coaches will induct

Corunna High graduate Philip Brooks, who has coached high school football for 24 years, will be inducted into the Michigan High School Football Coaches' Association Hall of Fame April 16 in Ann Arbor.

Brooks, a 1955 Corunna grad who now lives in Benton Harbor, has coached varsity football at Lake Michigan Catholic High School in St. Joseph since 1992. He owns a 24-year high school coaching record of 144-88-6.

Over the years, Brooks has also coached high school football at Corunna, Lansing Resurrection, Lansing Monsignor Gabriels High School and East Lansing High School.

He also served as head football coach at Alma College from 1971 through 1990. At Alma College, Brooks compiled a record of 98-84, winning Michigan Interscholastic Athletic Association (MIAA) titles in 1971, 1972 and 1988.

Brooks served as assistant at Eastern Michigan University in 1991. "This is a great honor," said Brooks when contacted by telephone Friday night. "We've had a lot of consistency over the years and I've had a lot of good assistant coaches and I've really had good kids who have worked very, very hard. You can't have a good football team without good kids who are willing to work hard."

Added the coach, "And I would also like to thank my wife, Rose, who is a 1957 graduate of Corunna High School."

Brooks has served as principal, athletic director and head football coach at Lake Michigan Catholic High School.

"This will probably be my last year," said Brooks. "I'm looking at retiring in June."


Brooks served as a varsity assistant for Charles Alexander and junior varsity head coach at Corunna in 1960 and 1961.

In 1962, he coached Lansing Resurrection High School to a 7-1 record and helped lead the school to the Capitol Circuit title.


In 1963, he began coaching at Lansing Monsignor Gabriels High School — now known as Lansing Catholic Central. Brooks compiled a record of 35-12-3 from 1963-68. In 1965, he led the team to a league crown and the team finished second in the state poll in Class B.


Brooks then moved on to coach varsity football at East Lansing High School in 1969 and 1970 with a record of 8-8-2. Along the way, East Lansing won a South Central Conference championship.

This record was obtained through the hard work of the team and the excellent coaching of Mr. Alexander and Mr. Phillips.




