
Gary retired from Woodards Furniture after 40 plus years of service, working as a welder in the R & D department.


Age 75, of St. Johns, passed away Friday, Sept. 5, 2014, at his home.

She is preceded in death by her sons, Mickey Van Luven and Scott Van Luven, her parents, and her 7 brothers and sisters.



it, and it turned out a great success and netted great profits.


Our Senior year was filled with more work. We sold taffy, and produced another play.






