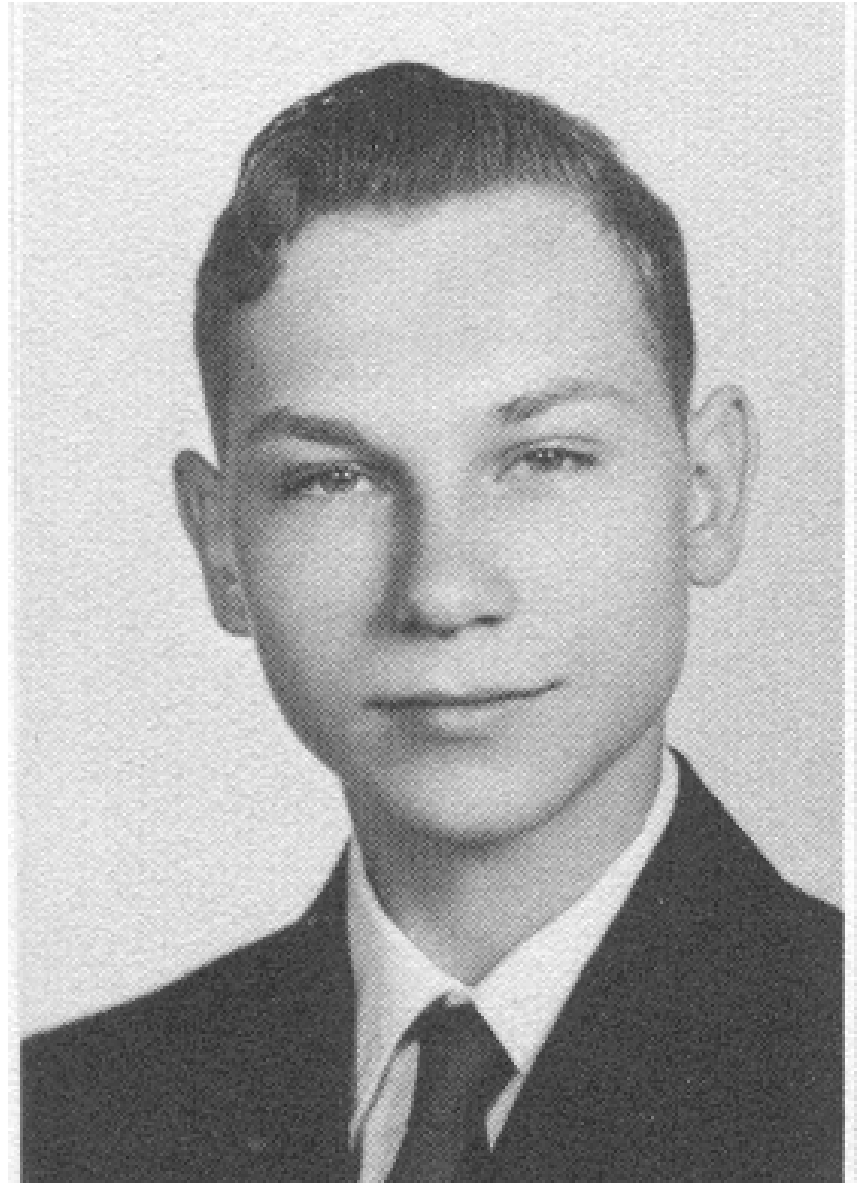
A funeral service will take place at 1 p.m. Thursday, May, 30, at Hillcrest Memorial Gardens in Owosso.

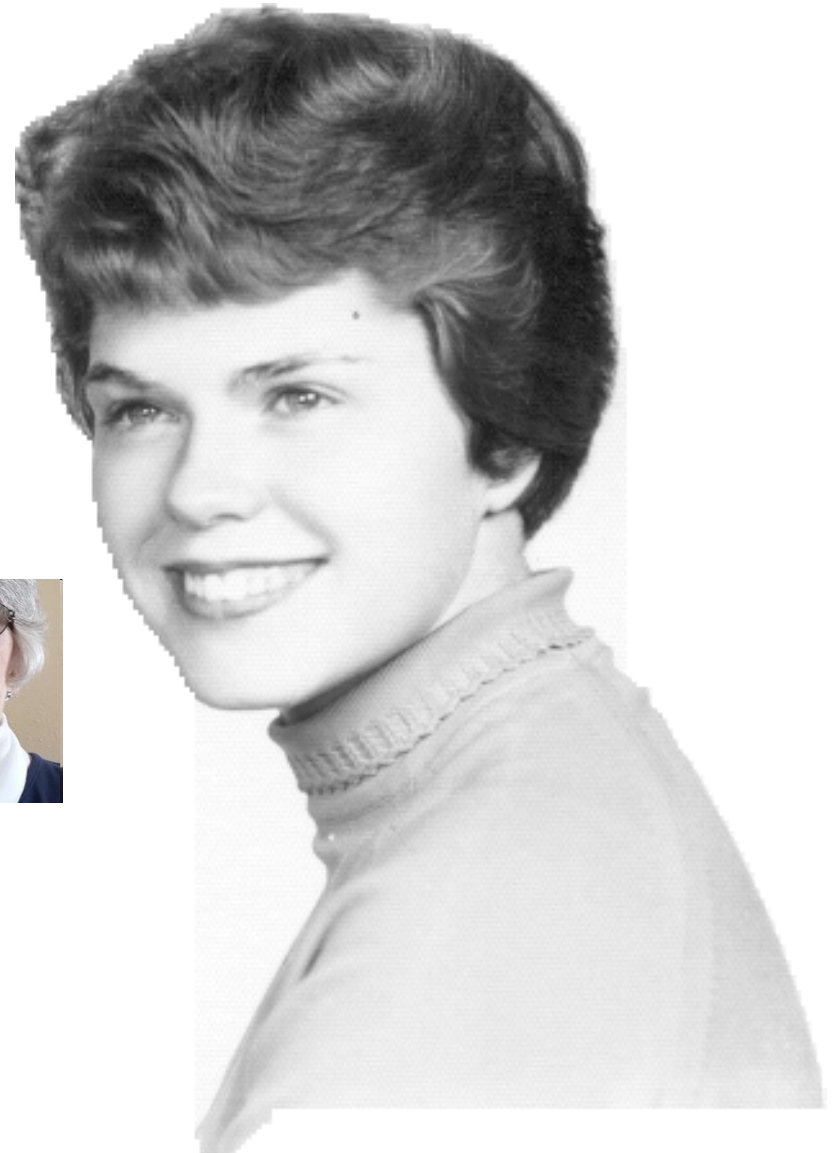
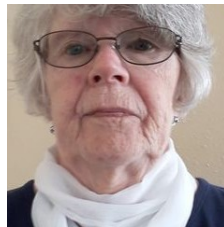

The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Casler of Corunna and is employed at Sturtevant and Blood Company in Owosso.

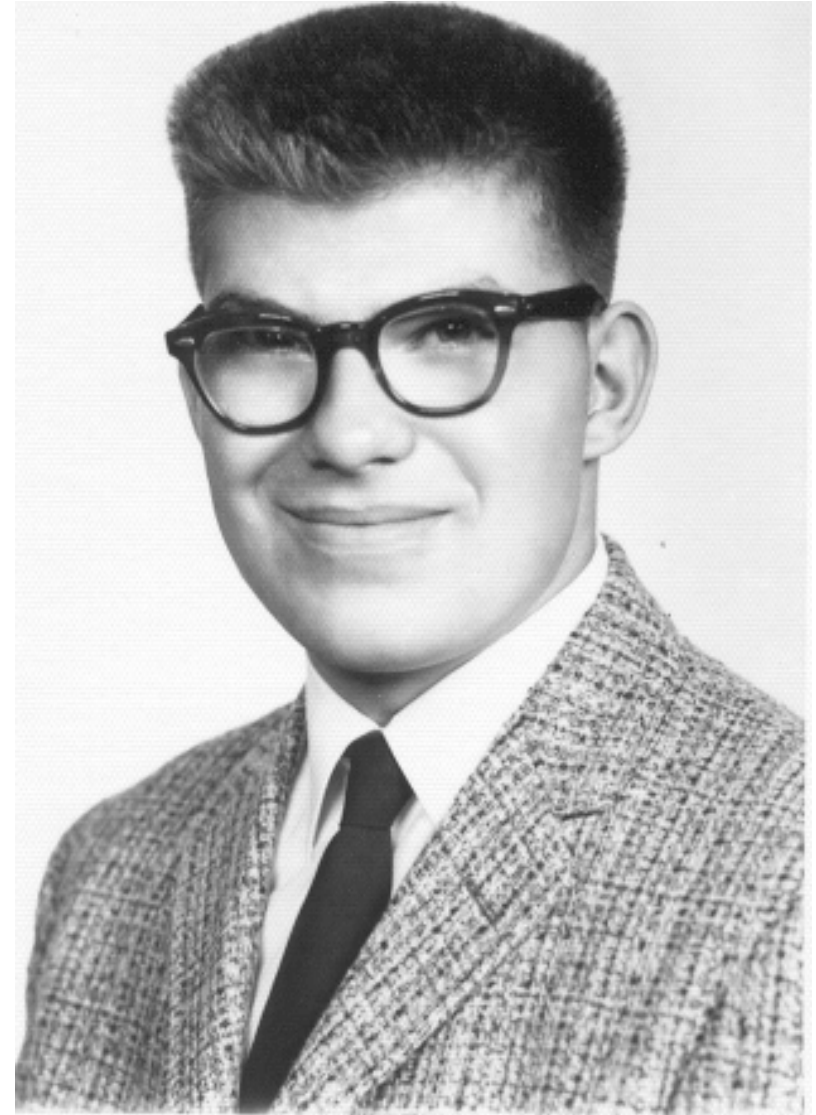

She was predeceased by: sisters, Marguerite (Mrs. Ward Youry), and Jean (Mrs. Steve Horvath).

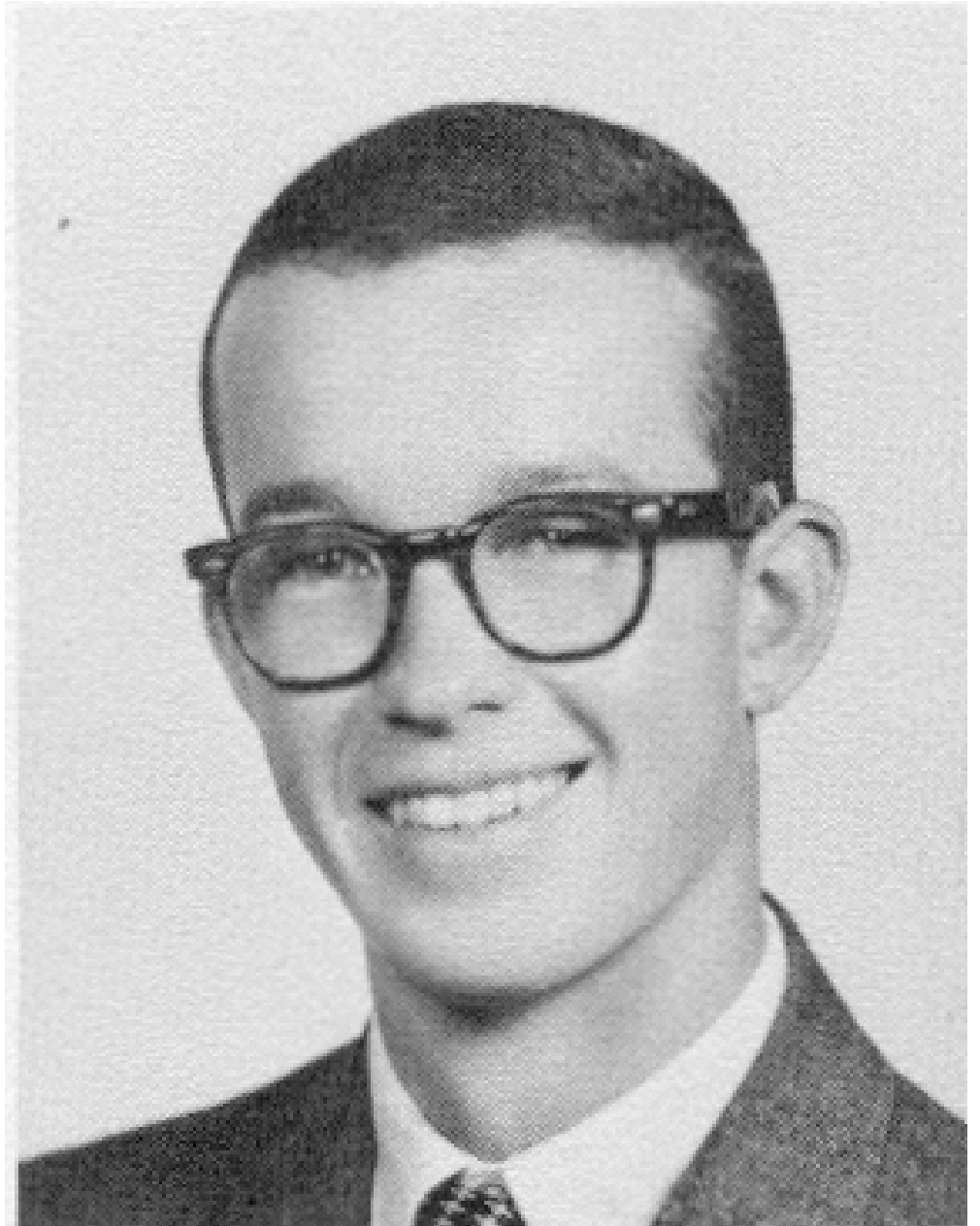

Sports pioneer 'Denny' Hill finally awarded her varsity 'W' from WMU

Pauline "Denny" Hill has always been a sports pioneer. Hill played in the inaugural All-American Girls' Professional Baseball League in 1947 for the Muskegon Lassies in the midst of a standout sports career in field hockey and tennis at Western Michigan College in Kalamazoo.

But, Hill — playing at Western Michigan under her maiden name of Pauline Dennert after graduating from Hart High School — was awarded little acclaim and never received a varsity 'W' letter from WMU officials.

Back then, varsity letters were awarded only to male athletes at Western and most other colleges.

That all changed, though, with last Sunday's awards banquet held on the WMU campus in Kalamazoo as part of Western Michigan University's 100-year anniversary.

Hill (Dennert) joined 189 other female athletes in receiving their varsity 'W' letters.

Hill's accompanying certificate reads: "Western Michigan University's Department of Intercollegiate Athletics proudly presents Pauline Dennert Hill her varsity 'W' letter for field hockey and tennis on October 18, 2003. This award recognizes your varsity sport participation and celebrates your student-athlete career accomplishments at Western Michigan University. Congratulations on your outstanding achievement. Your contributions are valued as an important part of WMU's athletic history."

Pauline Dennert was a two-year varsity tennis player for Western,

excelling as a doubles participant in 1947 and 1948. She played field hockey for the Broncos in 1947.

Dennert graduated from the Kalamazoo college in 1949.

She later married Jean Hill, who died in 1990. The couple had five children — daughters Patricia, Sue and Mary, and sons Paul and George. Hill still resides in the Clinton Street home in Owosso occupied by her family for the last 40 years.

Hill's sports pioneering didn't stop when she left the Muskegon Lassies and Western Michigan.

She came to Owosso in 1949, teaching for three years at Owosso High School, four years at Corunna High School and, on a part-time basis, three years at St. Paul Catholic School in Owosso.

Hill returned to Owosso High as a teacher and GAA (Girls Athletic Association) instructor in 1964, retiring in December of 1986 after making many prep sports inroads for girls with the advent of Title IX in 1973.

It was Hill who coached Owosso to its first (and only) girls' league basketball championship — the 1974 Big Nine Conference banner.

In addition to GAA and basketball, Hill also coached softball and was a cheerleading advisor for the Trojans.

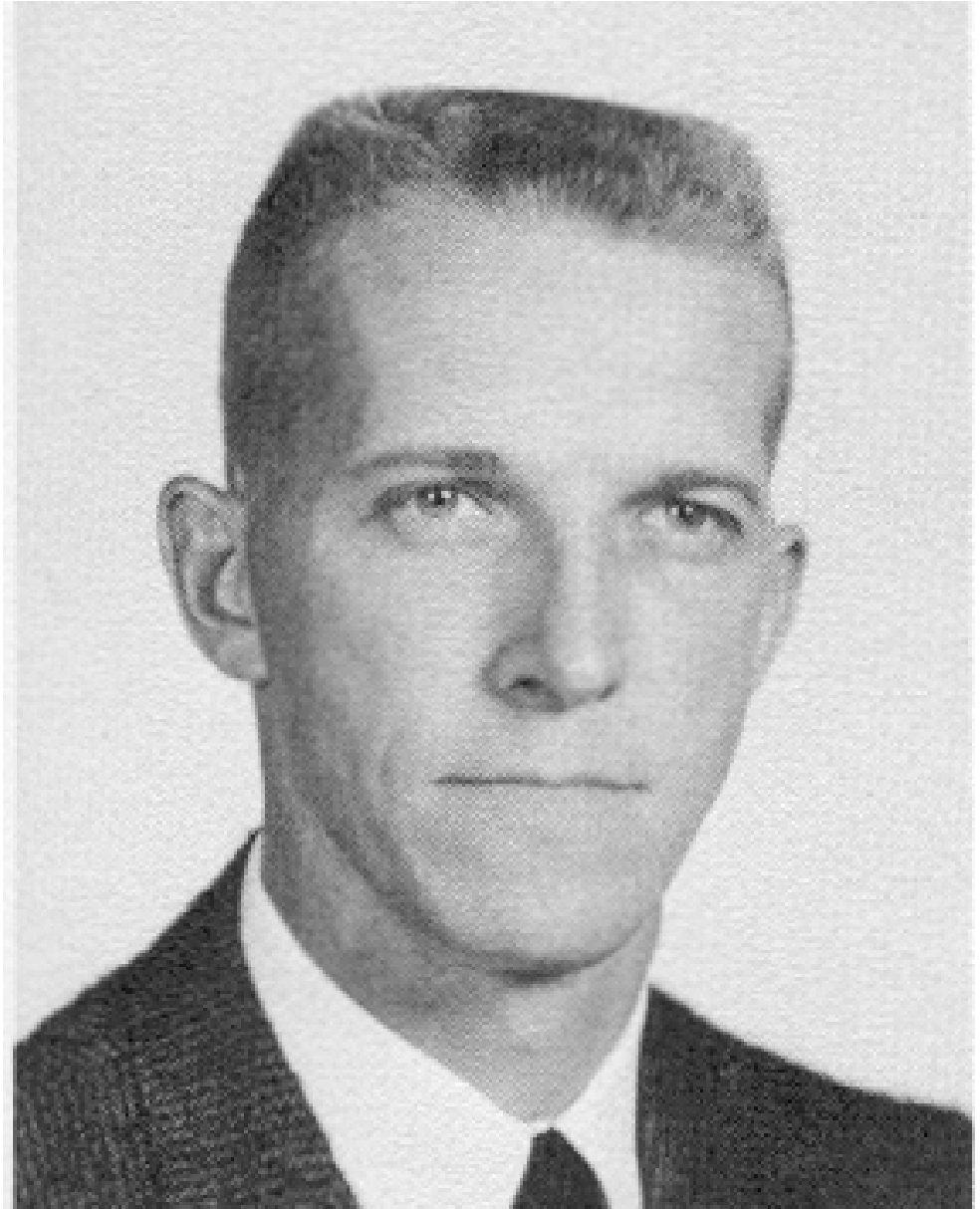
Owosso High honored Hill by naming its softball field after her, calling it the Pauline "Denny" Hill Softball Field and nicknaming it Denny's Diamond.

Now comes the added acclaim of receiving her long-overdue varsity 'W' from Western Michigan.

It all seems extremely appropriate for the former athletic great, coaching winner and pioneering champion of women's sports.

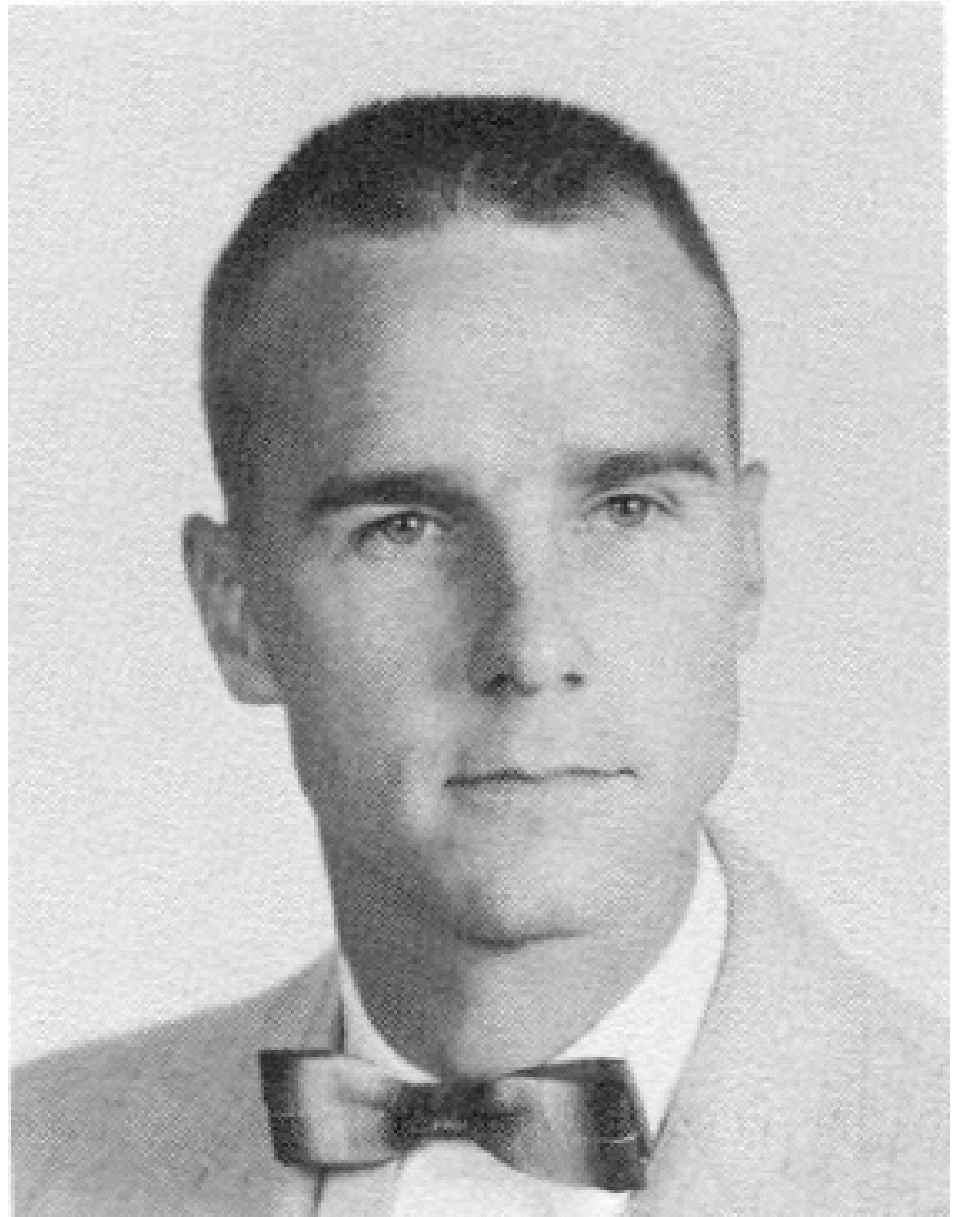

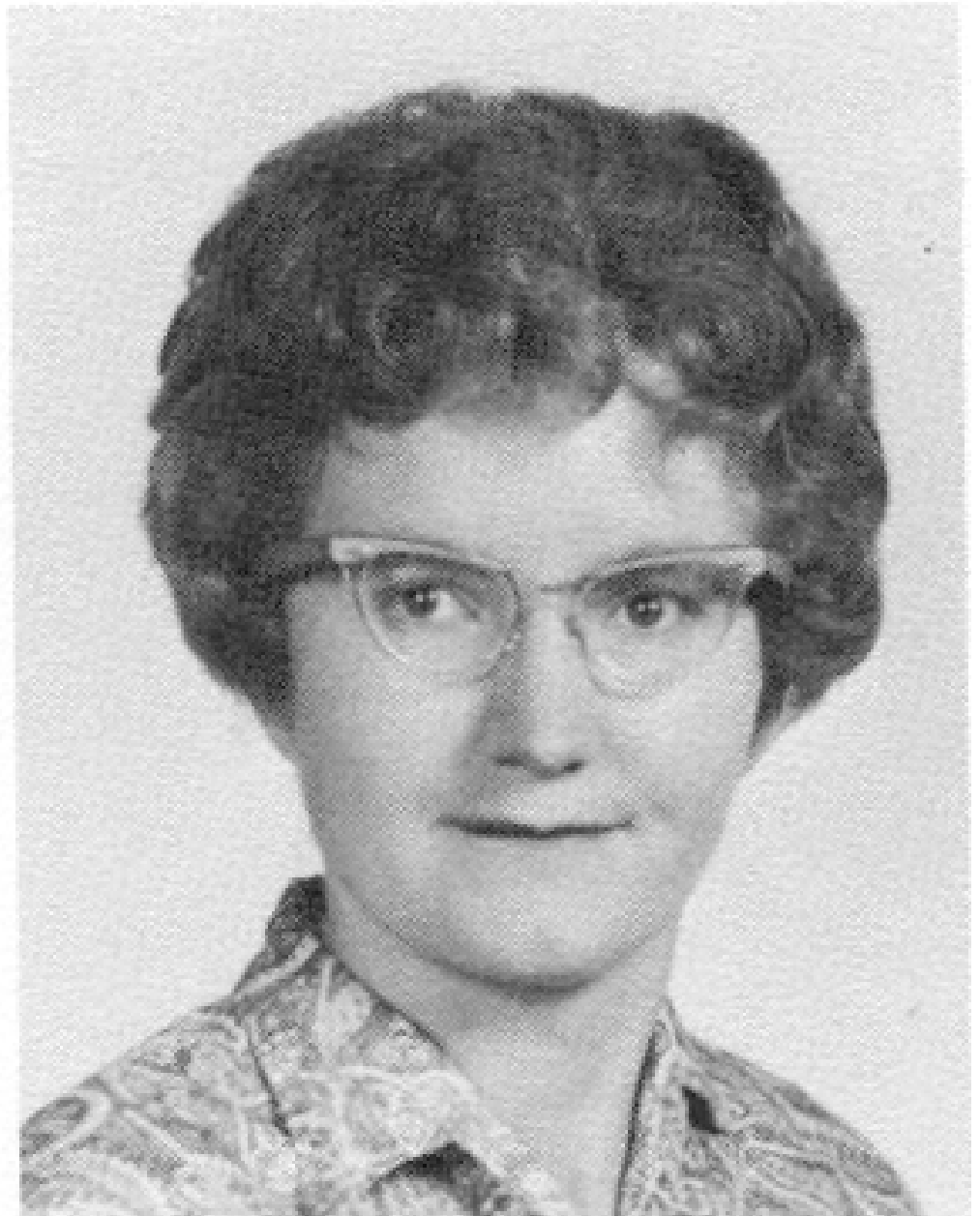

Inez Ross, former Owosso resident, makes 'Uncle Dudley' disappear

Inez Ross, 65, a former Owosso resident and 1948 graduate of Morrice High School, is responsible for making Uncle Dudley disappear.

That's right, Uncle Dudley, who is the main character in a delightful children's book about the "secret city" that was Los Alamos, N.M.

The book is based in the year 1943 and the time of the Manhattan project to develop the atomic bomb.

As an elementary-level narrative, the story tells of Uncle Dudley's disappearance during the war and his post-war emergence as a scientist who worked on the project.

"The characters are fictitious but the background is factual ... a historical novelette," she said, adding that the book is understandably selling well in the Los Alamos area.

Today, Ms. Ross is the featured writer at a book signing at The Bookshelf in Owosso from noon to 2 p.m.

"The Strange Disappearance of Uncle Dudley" is filled with archival and modern photographs with many of them blended using a computer layout process that allows them to be merged on the page.

It is a delightful 36-page paperback book that sells for \$6.98.

Ms. Ross, the former Inez Ashley, daughter of the late Elmer and Eunice Ashley of Owosso, comes from a long line of storytellers. Her mother was a storyteller and Ms. Ross fondly remembers her mother "telling stories to entertain little children."

Is it any wonder that Ms. Ross, while still in grade school, would tell stories on the bus to and from school to entertain her friends?

Even today her sister, Lois Whalen of Owosso, continues the family tradition as a local story teller.

Elementary School and graduated from Morrice High in 1948.

She moved to Los Alamos, N.M. in 1967 and taught high school English for 26 years there. She has a grown daughter, Lynette Ross, who is a design engineer in Palo Alto, Calif.

Now that she's retired, Ms. Ross is devoting more time to her writing and to travel. She is currently a stringer for the Monitor, a daily newspaper in Los Alamos.

"I enjoy entertaining other people with my reaction to travels or with unusual happenings," she said.

Along with her work at the newspaper Ms. Ross is busy writing a gothic romance mystery novel. She is also considering a book about walking the 800-mile Santa Fe trail, a project that was started with two friends, Cami Warton of Los Alamos and Judith Janay of Salida, Colo., who are also writers.

"The Santa Fe trail was more of a trading trail," she explained, adding that they plan to walk it from Santa Fe to Franklin, Mo. doing it in 10-mile segments.

Ms. Ross currently has a "lot of ideas" in the works for stories and said that perhaps one day she will do a story based in Owosso.

When asked where she gains her inspiration from, she smiled and said, "I get a lot of ideas while jogging."

An avid runner, Ms. Ross is planning to be in the 10K Curwood race and often takes part in road races in California with her daughter.

Her favorite author is Jane Austen and she is looking forward to an upcoming Jane Austen tour to England in the fall and is contemplating a book in a modern setting that is patterned after a Jane Austen plot, perhaps using Mackinac Island as the setting.
