





Linda worked for Crest Printing Co. in Owosso where she learned the trade. About 1978 she moved to Saginaw and worked for another printing company. Then 1980 Linda and I had a home built on 40 acres in Birch Run. Then, her only sibling a sister, June Berry, was killed in a car accident 1986. June still had one child, Lia 16 years old, living at home. We gladly took Lia in to our home to finish high school and then on to graduate from the University of Michigan. We thanked June every day of our lives for sharing her sweet beautiful daughter with us.

Linda had a desire to run her own printing company one day. Then when she turned 50 in 1993, we found a small printing company for sale in Saginaw. She purchased the business and ran it for over 25 years until she was 75 years old. She was a very dedicated, hard working women.

Then November 18th, 2020 she developed an extremely severe headache one evening that she could not stand any longer. I called 911 and 20 minutes later she was on her way to the hospital. About the time she arrived at the hospital she went into a coma. The wonderful doctor, against the rules, allowed me and Lia to stay with Linda until she was gone 8 hours later. She died from a Hemorrhagic Stroke, which is where the left side of her brain exploded. She is missed so very much by her older daughter Michele Bauer, Lia Wayne, and myself.

Age 60, of Owosso, passed away Tuesday, February 17, 2004, at his residence.


Mr. Bowers worked for Rugged Liner for 5 years in production, as a machinist and a truck driver.


He and the former Barbara Lutz were married July 12. 1968 in Farmington.



He will be dearly missed by family and friends.



Patricia enjoyed sewing, gardening and fishing. She looked forward to spending time with her family and loved ones, especially her fur babies.



Russ and his wife Dorothy have two children, Erick and Rachelle.


