John Francis Sternaman, age 76 of Owosso passed away on Friday, November 22, 2019 surrounded by his loving family at the Shiawassee County Hospice House.



The two attendants wore matching willow green circle headpieces to secure their short veils and each carried a cas-





After serving in the Civilian Conservation Corps as a young man, he undertook his preparation for the ministry in 1935.
