The couple has two children: Steve (Sarah) Bentley of Perry and Bobbi (Jeff) Pangborn of Morrice. They also have six grandchildren.



He also was a staff member at Nelson-House Funeral Homes for many, many years.




EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH

He was an avid sports fan, serving as statistician for football and basketball for both Corunna and Owosso Public Schools for many years, and he especially loved the Detroit Tigers.


